

# Miller Leaves Chamber

WOOSTER - The Wooster Area Chamber of Commerce is looking for a new executive director.

Al Miller's four-year contract expired Wednesday, and he accepted the position of director of corporate development with TechniGraphic Systems Inc., a Wooster-based digital mapping software company. He called the move an "awesome opportunity."

"My job will be corporate development and keeping all the pieces working together and helping them expand," Miller said.

Dee Vaidya, president and chief executive officer of TGS, said Miller will start with the company immediately.

"We've been growing so rapidly, and he's been coaching our management team for almost three years," Vaidya said.

According to Vaidya, Miller's role with the company will be to "actively look for expansion opportunities."

"He's helped us a great deal in the past, and as we continue to grow, we need all the help we can get and all the good people we can get," Vaidya said. "He's a human engineer with great people skills."

Board Chairman Mike Lezak said the chamber director's duties are being shared during the search for a new executive director.

"We're beginning our search for a new president immediately," Lezak said. "We've already appointed a group of directors to conduct that search. In the interim, we do have an executive committee composed of our officers, who will be taking over the day-to-day chores of president."

In a press release, the board noted Miller's leadership of its annual dinner and middle school scholarship fund and his contributions to the success of Wooster City School's recent school levy and superintendent search.

The chamber plans to acknowledge Miller with a reception in his honor.
